A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN REFLECTION

The First Baptist Church five-year Forward in Faith Capital Campaign "officially" ended August 31, 2023. Since the beginning of the campaign in September of 2018, more than \$285,000 in campaign pledges have been received, additional funds came in from the sale of church property, and several other gifts were designated to the capital campaign. Due to the faithful giving of FBC members and friends, the capital campaign funded the new roof for the sanctuary, paid for the new chiller installed a couple of years ago, and covered the repair of water damages from the busted pipe in December, as well as several smaller jobs. No loans were required for any of these projects!

The Stewardship Committee wishes to thank each of you who contributed to the wonderful success of the Forward in Faith Capital Campaign, and to remind you of the following:
